

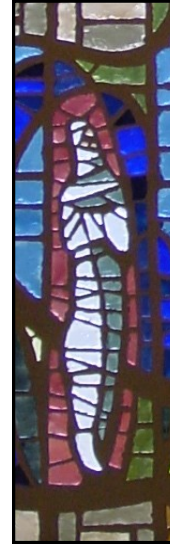

St. Paul Cemetery

was established in 1910 by the Catholics of Weirton as a permanent resting place for members of the community who have died and as a sacred place of prayer and reflection. It stands in the long and ancient Christian tradition of creating and maintaining burial sites until the great day of Resurrection with Christ.



- + In Saint Paul Cemetery, bodies of the faithful departed Catholics and their families may be interred in the ground, or entombed in mausoleums; their cremated remains may also be inurned in the ground or in mausoleum niches.
- + Rules and regulations regarding memorials, decorations and plantings seek to maintain a dignified appearance as well as protect the safety of visitors and maintenance workers.
- + On All Souls' Day (November 2), Memorial Day, and on other special occasions Saint Paul Parish celebrates the Sacred Eucharist at the Cemetery and offers prayer for all who have been laid to rest there.

Cemetery Regulations

- Persons may purchase resting places in Saint Paul Cemetery regardless of religious preference.
- Resting places must be paid in full before burial or entombment.
- No grave or mausoleum space shall be sold, assigned or transferred without the written permission of the cemetery, though this consent will not be withheld unreasonably.
- The Cemetery shall hold the preferred right to repurchase resting places an owner no longer wishes to retain.
- Interment of any person not a member of the family of the owner of the lot or grave shall not be allowed without the authorization of the cemetery and written approval of the owner.
- Saint Paul Cemetery shall have exclusive right to make interments and do other work in and about the Cemetery.
- No interments may be made on Sundays except in cases of emergency.
- Only steel, concrete or similarly permanent vaults are permitted for burials; impermeable crypt liners are required for entombment in the mausoleums.
- Holders of burial rights or their heirs shall notify the Cemetery office of all address changes.
- Memorials of cement, artificial stone, composition, wood, tin or iron are not permitted even for temporary use.
- Memorials, grave markers and stones are available for purchase from the Cemetery.
- Personal or family mausoleums shall be permitted only on lots designated by the Cemetery.

- Rocks and items made with glass (including lights) are not to be placed on graves for safety reasons.
- The Cemetery reserves the right to build all foundations for memorials to appropriate specifications; charges will be made through the memorial dealer.
- Monument companies must receive approval in writing from cemetery management for design, size and inscriptions prior to manufacture of any memorial.
- If a memorial becomes unsightly, dilapidated or a menace to visitors, the Cemetery shall have the right, at the expense of the lot owner, to correct the conditions or to remove the memorial.
- To facilitate the proper care of lots, planting of perennials or other plants may not be made directly on the grave, but must be placed at the base of the memorial and parallel to it. Since wire in artificial flowers can be a serious safety hazard during mowing season, only natural flowers are permitted from March 1 to November 1. Artificial flowers may be placed in urns or vases year round, never in the ground.
- Wilted and unsightly flowers may be removed by Cemetery staff during weekly maintenance. General clean-up will be held in late October and in March. Due to the volume of material collected no items can be saved. Therefore, families should remove any items they wish to retain.
- No trees or shrubs may be planted on graves. No flowers of any kind may be placed in the mausoleums or taped to a crypt front. Vases to decorate mausoleums are available from the cemetery office. Leaf-bearing and ornamental memorial trees may also be purchased through the office.
